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## North West Three Maths Hub led by the North West Learning Partnership

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The Maths Hubs programme for the first time brings together all mathematics education professionals in a national network of hubs, each locally led by an outstanding school or college, and in partnership with neighbouring schools, colleges, universities, CPD providers, maths experts and employers. This is a new way of harnessing all maths teaching expertise within an area, to spread excellent practice even more widely, for the benefit of all pupils and students.

As a Lead Maths Hub we will provide support to all schools in the area and across the North West, with a specific focus on St Helens, Wigan, Knowsley, Sefton and Liverpool, and across all areas of maths education including:

- recruitment of maths specialists into teaching
- initial training of maths teachers and converting existing teachers into maths specialists
- co-ordinating and delivering a wide range of maths continuing professional development (CPD) and school-to-school support
- ensuring maths leadership is developed, eg running a programme for aspiring heads of maths departments
- helping maths enrichment programmes to reach a large number of pupils from primary school onwards

## Lesson Design in a Mastery Context - New

## Moderation and Standardisation in Key Year Groups

### **This course is two sessions running in the autumn and spring terms**

We will look at where children are in the autumn term and what we can do between now and March to support them.

In Session 2 we will look at progress from autumn and what we can do for to support all learners for the rest of the year.

- How to implement 'keep up, not catch up' strategies using assessment to identify gaps and address common misconceptions
- Supporting teachers to monitor current provision, identifying gaps and planning next steps to ensure children are prepared to meet end of year national expectations
- A chance to moderate and standardise work samples

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## External Review

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As part of the ongoing QA processes that the North West Learning Partnership (formerly the St Helens TSA) are involved in, we are delighted to share some of the findings. An external review indicated that:

Membership of the TSA means that sometimes access is available to something that one school alone couldn't afford. "Suddenly something becomes a possibility."

Some Headteachers felt that their ability to quickly implement school improvement in schools in difficulty had been largely due to support from the Alliance. "It's really moved our school on."

"I'm really glad I joined. It was the best decision I made when I became a Headteacher."

The sharing of best practice among members and partners was seen to be one of the benefits of the TSA. This seems to be linked to the fact that Headteachers involved with the TSA are seen to be "...high calibre but also have humility."

A number of interviewees felt that their staff had benefited from helping others through the Alliance, either as Specialist Leaders of Education, Local Leaders of Education, trainers, or less formally. "The TSA makes things happen and schools benefit."

Headteachers could evidence positive effects of TSA membership with improved outcomes for children (supported by data), increased staff confidence, book scrutinies etc.

"St Helens TSA is just what a Teaching School should be about. It benefits the system, teaching and learning and children."

Network meetings are highly valued by teachers.

Headteacher meetings are felt to be purposeful and a high level of trust and mutual cooperation have been established.
