Times have changed...

The legacy messages around online safety may satisfy our obligations to teach in this area ...but there is little evidence that they have affected any real cultural change...

Children are good at barking back the messages covered in the lessons from the early days of “e-safety”...but evidence suggests it doesn't change things. Most are borne from a negative philosophy:

- **DON'T POST PRIVATE INFORMATION ONLINE**
- **ONLY HAVE FRIENDS YOU KNOW IN REAL LIFE**
- **THINK BEFORE YOU POST**
- **DON'T MEET UP**
- **SET PRIVACY RULES AND SETTINGS**



They are messages that don't even resonate with us in 2020... let alone children and young people, who are swimming in this online ocean every day of their lives.

They were of a time; but the Digital Literacy curriculum now requires more depth and sophistication, if it is to trigger the right conversations and genuinely make a difference.

Part 1 – Current Situation

Online Safety is EVERYONES responsibility!

- Skin Gambling on the increase
- In the first six months of 2020, 44% of all the child sexual abuse content dealt with by the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) involved self-generated material.
- 15% increase on 2019 when, of the 132,676 webpages actioned, almost a third (38,424) contained self-generated imagery.

26% of 13-17 year olds have had rumours about their sexual behaviour shared online in the last year, with 65% saying that girls are judged more harshly for this than boys.

47% of 13-17 year olds have witnessed their peers editing photos of someone to make them sexual e.g. placing sexual emojis over them or adding different faces to pornographic images.

31% of 13-17 year olds have seen their peers create fake profiles of someone they know to share sexual images, comments or messages.

2020 Online Safety is protecting and equipping C/YP from the 4 C's:

Content – What they access / interact with

Contact – Who they come into contact with online

Conduct – How they, and others, behave online

Commercialism – Use of platforms with hidden costs




