<b>COMMUNITY RADIO FUND</b>
<b>Deadline:</b>
Applications can be submitted until 5pm on the 14th January 2021.
<b>Details:</b>
Community radio stations that are facing severe financial difficulty and are at risk of closure due to the Covid-19 crisis can bid for grants to meet their urgent needs. Due to the ongoing impact of Covid-19, an additional £200,000 has now been made available for a third funding round in 2020-21 to support community radio stations which are taking steps to tackle loneliness and isolation within their communities. Applicants must be community radio licensees in the UK, and be on air by the time applications are considered. There is a maximum grant amount of £7,500 available in this round. Applications can be submitted until 5pm on the 14th January 2021.

<b>TECH FOR GOOD DIGITAL DEVELOPMENT FUND</b>
<b>Deadline:</b>
The fund will open for applications on the 7th January 2021. See website for deadline.
<b>Details:</b>
Not-for-profit organisations in the UK will be able to apply for grants of up to £70,000 to use technology to explore different approaches to delivering better services during the Covid-19 crisis. Over £1 million will be available to individual not-for-profit organisations or those working in partnership to define, test and develop user-centred digital solutions to create more impact for the people they work with. Applications that aim to adapt or re-purpose existing technology are also eligible for funding. The programme aims to fund a portfolio of digital projects at different stages of development, and will support a range of digital interventions. The funding is being made available through the Tech for Good digital development fund 'Build' programme which is being supported by the Paul Hamlyn Foundation and Comic Relief.

In response to Covid-19 the Asda Foundation has stopped its usual grant making activities and launched its Covid-19 Grants. The Hygiene grant is focused on personal hygiene dignity, supporting residents/patients in facilities, who are struggling and unable to provide their own toiletries either through lack of funds or access to family support. The fund is open to applications from care homes, hospices, hospitals and homeless shelters. The maximum grant available is £500.

The Department of Health and Social Care has made £5 million available to support voluntary and community sector (VCS) mental health providers which are experiencing an increase in demand for their services due to coronavirus. Through the Coronavirus Mental Health Response Fund,

small and large grants of between £5,000 and £50,000 are available to help increase mental support for people with and at risk of developing mental health problems.

In response to the coronavirus pandemic, a new £10 million Grants Programme will be launched to provide support to 200 small-medium charities and social enterprises within the social sector. The Rank Foundation's Time to Shine Covid-19 Resilience Programme will offer immediate, short-term and urgent grant funding to organisations primarily within their network, RankNet, that are facing unprecedented demand for services, or those who have suffered a significant reduction in income due to the pandemic. In addition, organisations will take part in the Time to Shine Leadership Programme to create new jobs within the social sector and to help build resilience. The Foundation has received £5 million in match-funding from the Government's Community Match Challenge scheme.

The Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport has announced an emergency funding package to protect the immediate future of grassroots and national youth organisations. £16.5m will be available through the Youth Covid-19 Support Fund for grassroots youth clubs, uniformed youth groups, and national youth and umbrella organisations across the UK. The funding will be allocated from the government's <a href="#">£750m package</a> of support, of which more than £60m has already been provided to organisations working with vulnerable children and young people.

<b>ROSA COVID-19 RESPONSE FUND</b>
<b>Deadline:</b>

<b>Details:</b>
Rosa, a grant making charity that funds grassroots women's organisations, has announced plans to build a Covid-19 response fund that gives multi-year grants to specialist not-for-profit organisations led by and for Black and minoritised (BME) women across the UK. Rosa aims to raise a minimum of £1 million for this fund to meet the holistic needs of disadvantaged BME women and girls who have been hardest hit by the pandemic such as those with disabilities, older women, LGBTQ+, homeless women, and survivors of gender violence. The Fund will provide a tailored and responsive support package including the opportunity to join an online platform, access online training, take part in smaller discussion groups, and more.

<b>COVID WORKFORCE FUND</b>
<b>Deadline:</b>
No deadline specified.

<b>Details:</b>
The Department for Education has announced a short-term Covid Workforce Fund to support schools and colleges facing financial and staffing pressures due to the Covid-19 pandemic in England. Schools and colleges will be able to reclaim costs incurred over the course of the current half term, if they meet the following conditions:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Financial: Schools will first need to use any existing financial reserves, as we would typically expect when facing unforeseen costs. They will be eligible for this additional funding once they have used these down to a level at 4% of the annual income. Colleges' eligibility will be based on their cash position set out in the November financial return.</li> <li>• Absence rates: Mainstream schools and colleges must be experiencing a short-term teacher absence rate at or above 20%, and/or a lower long-term teacher absence rate at or above 10% - costs can only be claimed when incurred above this rate.</li> <li>• Absence rates: Special schools and Alternative Provision schools must be experiencing a short-term teacher absence rate at or above 15%, and/or a lower long-term teacher absence rate at or above 10%, to be eligible - costs can only be claimed when incurred above this rate.</li> </ul>
Claims for support staff absences will be on an exceptional only basis, where necessary in keeping schools and colleges open. In special/AP schools, there will be greater flexibility for claims for these staff. Claims can include the cost of bringing in supply teachers but also other options such as paying additional hours for teachers who are part time (provided these teachers are happy to temporarily increase their hours, and full consideration is given to their workload and wellbeing). Funding will apply to the current half term and will be backdated to 1 November 2020. Guidance on the claims process will be published shortly.

The £1.3m Workertech Partnership provides seed funding & support for ventures that use technology to improve workers' pay, prospects, power & career choices. The new programme builds on a successful pilot scheme, led by Resolution Foundation, which has already supported ventures that have helped hundreds of 1000's of workers. Applications are invited from charities, companies, CICs and cooperatives across the UK, with plans to build worker-focused platforms, apps and online tools - from accessing training, to amplifying workers' voices and assessing whether work sites are Covid-secure.

Grants of up to £1,000 are available to small & medium-sized charities, CICs & registered societies which are struggling to manage the financial impact of Covid either because of increased demand for their services or from loss of income. The Fund will provide support to organisations which are in a critical position & operating in one of the following categories: education relating to non-domestic animals; visual & performing arts; medical research; relief of disability or severe illness; accommodation of those in need. Funding can be used to cover costs i.e., staff costs, other overheads, changes to working practices e.g. laptop purchase & PPE.

The Return to Play Fund is made up of three parts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a £10m <a href="#">Small grants</a> which will provide grants of £300-£10,000 to help sport and activity groups, clubs and organisations respond to the immediate challenges of returning to play in a Covid-19-safe environment;</li> <li>• a £5m <a href="#">Community Asset Fund</a> that will provide grants ranging in value from £10,001 to £50,000 to help local sports clubs and organisations to adapt and open important places and spaces that can help them welcome back their local community safely;</li> <li>• and a £1.5m Active <a href="#">Together Fund</a> which is a crowdfunding initiative will help sports clubs and organisations set up their own campaigns to help sustain them through the crisis.</li> </ul> <p>The Fund will especially seek to support those groups/organisations working with audiences that Sport England have identified as finding it more difficult to be active at this time. Including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Black, Asian and minority ethnic communities;</li> <li>• People on lower incomes;</li> <li>• Those disproportionately affected financially as a result of the crisis;</li> <li>• Disabled people and people with long-term health conditions;</li> <li>• Those who are experiencing a greater burden of care responsibilities since pandemic began.</li> </ul>

<b>Details:</b>
In response to the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on merchant seafarers, fishers & their families, Seafarers UK has created a COVID-19 Emergency Fund. The new fund is intended for distribution in 20/21, with 75% allocated to the international merchant seafaring community & 25% to UK coastal fishing fleets. Grants from Seafarers UK are offered to charities and other organisations providing frontline & support services to merchant seafarers, UK fishers and their families.

## NATIONAL TUTORING PROGRAMME

**Deadline:**

No deadline specified.

**Details:**

The government has announced £1b of funding to support children and young people to catch up. This includes a one-off universal £650m catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time. The Government has also launched a £350m National Tutoring Programme to provide additional, targeted support for those children and young people who need the most help. The £650m of universal catch-up premium funding will be available for all state-funded mainstream and special schools, and alternative provision. It will cover:

- primary, secondary & all through local authority-maintained schools, academies & free schools;
- local authority-maintained special schools;
- special academies and free schools;
- special schools not maintained by a local authority;
- pupil referral units;
- alternative provision (AP) academies and free schools;
- local authority-maintained hospital schools and academies;
- independent special schools.

The £350m National Tutoring Programme will comprise of at least 3 parts in the 2020 to 2021 academic year, including:

- a [5 to 16 programme](#) that will make high-quality tuition available to 5-16-year old's in state-funded primary & secondary schools from the second half of autumn term 2020.
- a 16-19 fund for school sixth forms, colleges & all other 16-19 providers to provide small group tutoring activity for disadvantaged 16-19 students whose studies have been disrupted as a result of coronavirus - guidance setting out further detail of this element will be issued shortly.
- a [reception year early language programme](#) that will make training and resources available at no-cost to schools where additional targeted support for oral language would be particularly beneficial. Schools should register their interest to participate in the early language programme by the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2020.

## TESCO BAGS OF HELP SCHEME

**Deadline:**

Applications can be made at any time.

**Details:**

At the end of September, the Tesco Bags of Help COVID-19 Communities Fund will close and in its place during October, November & December Tesco will be providing grants of £1000 to support projects focused on local children/young people. Type of projects funded could include:

- Mental Health support for children and young people – COVID-19 has had an impact on the health and wellbeing of children, particularly mental health.
- Outdoor activities – sport & green space provision for children & young people including use of green spaces support wellbeing through physical activities.
- Non statutory educational activities – to support, widen and rebuild educational support networks for children, web-based activities. Sport, exercise, and arts.
- Young carers– support for young carers as a result of current and continued isolation.
- Bereavement counselling – offering support to children that have lost family members and support networks due to COVID-19
- Child poverty – to support organisations that offer family support that are further impacted by COVID-19, which could include food/educational packs, free activities.
- Vulnerable at-risk children – the pandemic has impacted vulnerable children with challenging

home & family circumstances.

Other local good causes supporting children and young people will also be considered. Eligible applicants include charities, voluntary or community organisations, schools, health bodies, Parish/Town Councils, local authorities and social housing providers. Projects should last up to 12 months and can be a stand-alone project or discrete, self-contained part of a larger scheme, or part of a phased project. Funding can be used to cover 100% of project costs.

## COMIC RELIEF'S CAPACITY BUILDING GRANTS SCHEME

**Deadline:**

Applications can be made at any time.

**Details:**

Charities, voluntary and community organisations, social enterprises and CIC's which have been negatively impacted by Covid-19 can apply for grants of up to £1,000 to help them rebuild their capacity to meet the needs of their local community. The funding will support projects within their four strategic themes. To be eligible, applicants will need to have an annual income of less than £250,000. The grants can be used for a wide range of activities, such as:

- Developing better organisational governance through training of your trustees;
- Reviewing or updating your policies and procedures to take into account any new ways of working due to the crisis;
- Increasing your understanding of the needs of your beneficiaries both during and after the crisis and developing ways to best support them;
- Increasing your organisational delivery capacity through additional volunteer recruitment, staff training or new equipment to enable your organisation to deliver services in different ways;
- Developing strategies to support your organisation to rebuild moving forward (e.g. fundraising strategies, developing delivery plans, exploring how you can work in different ways etc.)

<b>THE UK INSURANCE COVID-19 SUPPORT FUND</b>

<b>Details:</b>
The UK insurance & long-term savings industry has launched a Covid-19 Support Fund to support vulnerable and disadvantaged people affected by the crisis. The Fund aims to raise a total of £100m, with £82.6m already pledged in voluntary donations from firms across the sector. The key aim is to provide immediate relief to charities affected by Covid-19, as well as a longer-term programme of support for people, communities, & issues where there is greatest need, including:

We have seen that many charities have adapted or extended their services.
