

- Treat implementation as a process, not an event; plan and execute it in stages.
- 2 Create a leadership environment and school climate that is conducive to good implementation.

EXPLORE

3 Define the problem you want to solve and identify appropriate programmes or practices to implement.

PREPARE

5 Support staff, morator progress, solve problems, and adapt strategies as the approach is used to the first time.

SHISTAIN

6 Plan for sustaining and scaling an intervention from the outset and continuously acknowled and nurture its use.



PUTTING EVIDENCE TO WORK: A SCHOOL'S GUIDE TO IMPLEMENTATION

Implementation theme - Professional development



Ensure a tight focus on pupil outcomes by supporting staff to apply general pedagogy to specific subject domains

Professional development activities are unlikely to be successful without ensuring there is both high-quality content and a sharp focus on pupil outcomes. Many of the EEF's most promising projects are precise in terms of the teaching practices they are introducing, and provide explicit support to help teachers apply general pedagogy to specific subject domains i.e. pedagogical content knowledge.⁵

At the D & AHT Conference on Friday 24th March we will be focusing on pedagogy and discovering more about pedagogical content knowledge.
