

The 10 top tips from EEF

- 1. Know your school's attainment gaps.
- 2. Benchmark your school against other, similar schools.
- 3. Understand the evidence of 'what works' to improve teaching and learning.
- 4. Make closing the attainment gap a key part of your overall SI Plan.
- 5. Take the lead in signing off your school's Pupil Premium strategy.
- 6. Invest first in the quality of teaching at your school.
- 7. Think hard about what additional targeted support is needed.
- 8. Before you buy in a programme, check with EEF!
- 9. Support effective implementation of new teaching and learning strategies in your school.
- 10. Think carefully about what your school should stop doing.



National professional qualifications (NPQs)

National professional qualifications

NPQs are available for teachers and leaders who want to develop their knowledge and skills in specialist areas of teaching practice. There are 4 leadership NPQs in senior leadership, headship, executive leadership and early years leadership

What's involved

The specialist and leadership NPQs provide training and support for teachers and school leaders at all levels. This includes those who want to develop expertise in high quality teaching practices, such as behaviour management, and those leading multiple schools across trusts.

The leadership NPQs are:

<u>Senior leadership</u> – develop your leadership knowledge and expertise to improve outcomes for teachers and pupils in your school

<u>Headship</u> – develop the knowledge that underpins expert school leadership and apply it to become an outstanding headteacher

<u>Executive leadership</u> – develop the expertise you need to become an outstanding executive leader, leading change and improvement across your group of schools or multi-academy trust

<u>Early years leadership</u> – develop expertise in leading high-quality early years education and care, as well as effective staff and organisational management
